

Healthy Child Care America Survey 2009



In 2009, Healthy Child Care America (HCCA) conducted a survey of its early education and child care colleagues through various electronic distribution lists. The results from this survey will be used to guide the program's future efforts.

Of the 666 respondents, the majority identified themselves as child care health consultants (24%). This was followed by child care providers/directors at 17%, child care trainers at 16%, and public health employees at 11%.

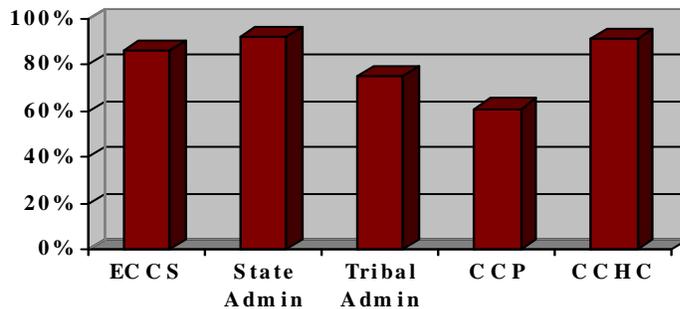

The survey participants were asked to rate the HCCA activities and resources. The Web site, electronic distribution lists, and resource distributions by mail were rated most favorable. Some respondents were unaware of all of the available activities and resources from HCCA. Therefore, future efforts will include marketing what HCCA has to offer.

The publication *Caring for Our Children National: Health and Safety Performance Standard: Guidelines for Out-of-Home Child Care Programs, 2nd Edition* consists of national child care health and safety standards that are endorsed by the American Academy of Pediatrics. Overall, 73% (337) of survey respondents were familiar with this resource.

In particular, 86% (12) of Early Childhood Comprehensive Systems (ECCS) Coordinators, 92% (11) of Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) State Administrators, 75% (12) of CCDF Tribal Administrators, 61% (42) of child care providers/directors, and 91% (117) of child care health consultants are familiar with this resource.

Regarding its use, 52% (173) of all respondents use it all of the time or most of the time, and 49% (57) of child care health consultants reported using the publication all the time! The survey results regarding *Caring for Our Children* have been shared with the HCCA partners at the National Resource Center for Health and Safety in Child Care and Early Education to enhance their work as well.

"This [SIDS online module] would save program time as I currently am a state trainer for SIDS/Shaken Baby and the presentation and training session is about 2 hours. Currently I have to provide for just one or two people at a time so an online module would be more cost effective if it met the state guidelines. (Wisconsin)"

HCCA is in the process of developing an online module on the topic of safe sleep guidelines and Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS). Health care professionals, child care providers, parents/relatives, and babysitters will be able to complete the educational module for free. Overall, 80% (367) of respondents reported that this online module would be very useful or somewhat useful. Also, 83% (376) of respondents would be interested in additional online modules on other health and safety topics provided by HCCA.
